Safety around School

It's great to see so many families travelling to and from school in an active way. However, as our school continues to grow and pedestrian traffic around school increases at dropoff and pick-up times, please remember that all children should push their bikes and scooters once they are onsite, to help keep everyone safe.

EYFS

This term, we have been finding out about different animals and some of the habitats that they live in. We have explored grouping animals in different ways, looked closely at the patterns on their fur and skin and also found out how to care for animals.

During British Science Week, we investigated how to grow plants. We are currently looking after our potato crop and can't wait for them to grow! We also loved our visit from Curious Creatures and we all showed bravery and confidence by stroking the snakes, lizards and dragons!

We have finished our term by finding out how to look after our environment. The children have loved becoming 'Environmental Warriors'.







Class 1

Class 1 have been busy this half term! Our main focus has been looking at Our Country; during our Geography lessons, we have been looking at naming the four countries of the UK, as well as their capital cities and even some facts about each city. In Science, we have been looking at how the weather is changing now that we are in Spring and how this season is all about new life. Our spring walk allowed us to observe how the world around us is changing all of the time.

In Maths, the children have had their first look at multiplication. We have looked at making and adding equal groups, which has also allowed us to practice counting in 2s, 5s and 10. In English, we have written our own descriptions of the Bog Baby; writing a letter from George, the Smartest Giant in Town as well as writing a non-chronological report about Emperor Penguins. The children thoroughly enjoyed researching and learning facts about these interesting animals.

We have also been researching different types of puppets in DT, how we can join them together and then designing our own. We looked at making our own hand puppet, and embellishing these with buttons, wool and other items to make it look like a character from a story. Class 1 showed a lot of resilience when creating their puppets!

They continue to develop their independence when working across all subjects and it has been great to see them making some incredible progress! Well done Class 1 for another super half term!







Class 2

Spring 2 has been a busy half-term full of fun and learning! We have had the excitement of British Science Week, visiting reptiles from Curious Creatures and maths-battling on TT Rockstars!

Over the last half-term, we have been learning all about pitch in Music. This has seen us develop our singing voices. It has been so lovely to hear so maymany children singing so beautifully.



In science, we have been considering which animals give birth to live young, which animals lay eggs and have also considered what all living things need to survive. Learning all about direction and shape has been our main focus in Maths. The children really enjoyed taking chalk outside to draw 2D shapes; some children even challenged themselves to write how many vertices and sides the shapes had, before we explored this in the classroom.

In English, we have continued with our theme of animals, and have read Meerkat Mail – the children have thoroughly enjoyed creating their own character and writing about their adventure. This also included the children drawing and writing their own postcards that they could send back to their relatives.







Class 3

Class 3 have worked extremely hard this half term. In science they have been physicists and botanists, testing the strength of magnetic materials and growing their own plants! They have also worked extremely hard in geography to develop their knowledge of tectonic plates, volcanic eruptions and earthquakes. Their main focus in English has been the story 'Escape from Pompeii' and they have blown Miss Frances away with their excellent use of inference, adverbials and direct speech.

In Maths, they continue to be times table champions, challenging themselves to learn more and apply their knowledge faster each week.

Class 3 have taken part in lots of hands-on learning too with a beautiful day spent in our Forest School; building dens and making potions. They have also made their own mosaics, dabbled in some pottery, printed repeating patterns onto fabric and then designed and constructed magnetic board games. Well done, Class 3!








School Clubs
